Complaints Procedures

In the event that none of these people are available then please ring the office 01484 223969 and make an appointment to see Diana Wilson Headteacher.

After a meeting with the Headteacher if you are still concerned you should then make a complaint in writing which the Headteacher will acknowledge within 3 school days and respond to within 15 school days.

If you are still concerned then you may have your complaint forwarded to the Chair of Governors Ali Stopher, who will then offer to meet you and discuss your complaint.

The Chair of Governors may then as a result of your concerns convene the Governing Body Complaints panel or other external party to investigate.
