

## Birkby Infant & Nursery School Pupil Premium proposed allocation—2015/2016

## Together we can

At Birkby Infant & Nursery School everyone is committed to providing a happy, secure and inviting community where all stakeholders feel cared for, valued and where good relationships and a positive attitude to learning are developed.

The Pupil premium is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers.

The Pupil Premium is allocated in local authority maintained and non-maintained schools to children from low income families who are known to be eligible for free school meals (FSM); children who have been eligible for free school meals anytime in the last six years (called Ever6 FSM); those children in local authority care and children whose parents are in the armed forces.

Birkby Infant & Nursery School recognises that **all** children should have equal access to a curriculum which will enable them to reach their potential.

Birkby Infant & Nursery School considers carefully how it spends the Pupil Premium funding, with a focus on narrowing and ultimately closing the achievement gap.

Annually we have to account for how the funding has been spent and the impact the funding has had.

A consistent member of staff outdoors will enable continuity and progression for children utilising the outdoor learning classroom and ensure that they can build on previous learning and that child initiated learning can be more easily facilitated and further developed. More accurate reporting on the progress of children and feed-back to the teachers will improve children's progress towards the early learning goals and raise attainment. Children are taken for walks in the neighbourhood in small groups to develop their basic literacy skills and widen their experience and collect things to use in their outdoor learning area.

This work is supported by 3 days admin to input attendance data into Integris, do all first day calling, and all follow up paper work(Fast Track) and a Local Authority Education Social Worker who makes follow up home visits and meets parents in school.  Improved attendance will improve children's attainment as well as self-esteem and confidence.

Approximately 25 Pupil premium children are benefitting from regularly attending breakfast club which is ensuring they have an appropriate breakfast and a nurturing time before school begins.
After School Club Staffing 3 members of staff	£13504 50% <b>£6752</b>	Approximately 25 children benefit from our After School Care Club that provides a light but nutritious tea and games and opportunity to have supervised play both inside and outside. This enables a number of parents to volunteer, undertake training etc which does not always end before the end of the school day.

(This is essential as many of our children do not go swimming until Birkby Juniors School in Year 4 which for many is too late for them to be able to develop into a confident swimmer and also means they have no awareness of the dangers of water).

PASS Survey Staff	£420 39% <b>£168</b> £622 39% <b>£242</b>	The PASS survey is completed every term by a member of the pastoral team to give us an idea of the attitudes that the children are bringing to their learning. This in turn informs teaching and learning strategies and intervention programmes to help raise standards of attainment and well-being.  The whole cohort profile PASS Survey March 2015 showed that 94.9% had positive feelings about school,96.3% were prepared for learning, 91.8% had learner self-worth.
