Promoting Good Behaviour

We inform children of expectations and reward good behaviour with :

- Rainbow tickets.
- Smiles and spoken praise.
- Praise from the class.
- Star of the week.
- Stickers.
- Certificate and badge in Best Work assembly.— for those children who have kept all their Rainbows for the full term.
- Rainbow Time.
- Whole class award.
- Informing parents at home time, letters or report.

Pupil Leaders

Pupils who have good attendance (90% and above) and keep ALL their Rainbows for 6 consecutive weeks will be given the opportunity to become a Pupil Leader for their class.

They will be responsible for:-

Leading their class to and from the classroom, welcoming visitors to school and being their class representative at school meetings.

Sanctions

Although we always aim to emphasise the positive there are times when children have to be dis-ciplined.

This could include:-

- Loss of a 'rainbow' from their bank of 5, should they lose 5 then 'Rainbow Time' is lost. :(
- Being spoken to by an adult.
- Loss of playtime—hold hands with an adult on playground duty.
- Time out within their own classroom.
- Reporting to a senior member of staff.
- Missing Rainbow Time.
- Parents being contacted.

Parents will be informed if their child has lost all their 'Rainbows'.

Children's behavior is closely monitored by Mrs. Todd (Inclusion Manager) for identification of children who may need further support/ intervention.

If a child continues to lose their Rainbow Time each week an alternative behavior system may be put in place whereby the child has to earn their 'Rainbows' for appropriate behavior throughout the week.

Use of agreed physical handling/restraint (Team Teach) will be used as a last resort should a child become very upset and lash out physically putting themselves or others at risk.

Anti-Bullying Bullying , a definition — when a person or persons deliberately set out to intimidate or humiliate their victim in order to cause distress or fear, using physical, verbal or indirect means.

It is a basic entitlement of all children, irrespective of gender, ability, disability, race, religion or belief, to receive their education free from humiliation, oppression and abuse.

How can I help? -

- Be a good role model.
- Keep communication between school and yourself throughout the school year.
- Talk to your child about their day.
- Be consistent at home and set barriers.
- Be strong ... if you say 'no' it stays 'no'.
- Focus on the positive.
- Remind your child you love them.
