

Birkby Infant & Nursery School Pupil Premium proposed allocation—2020/2021

Together we can

At Birkby Infant & Nursery School everyone is committed to providing a happy, secure and inviting community where all stakeholders feel cared for, valued and where good relationships and a positive attitude to learning are developed.

The Pupil premium is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers.

The Pupil Premium is allocated in local authority maintained and non-maintained schools to children from low income families who are known to be eligible for free school meals (FSM); children who have been eligible for free school meals anytime in the last six years (called Ever6 FSM); those children in local authority care and children whose parents are in the armed forces.

Birkby Infant & Nursery School recognises that **all** children should have equal access to a curriculum which will enable them to reach their potential. 93% of Birkby Infant and Nursery School children live in the most deprived areas (0%-40%), 88% of the children have English as a second language, approximately 20% are SEN and approximately 22% are entitled to FSM and ever FSM.

Birkby Infant & Nursery School considers carefully how it spends the Pupil Premium funding, with a focus on narrowing and ultimately closing the achievement gap. Annually we have to account for how the funding has been spent and the impact the funding has had.

Attendance Family Support Officer Strategy to improve attendance of all children including 28% of FSM/Ever 6 children.	£30,168 = CI 28% £8,447	Persistent non-attendance/intermittent attendance and punctuality is dealt with by the Family Support officer who regularly monitors and addresses attendance issues and related data feeding back weekly to the Head teacher and the Governing Body half termly. Along with 3 days admin to input attendance data into Integris, do all first day calling, and all follow up paper work (Fast Track) and a Local Authority Education Social Worker who makes follow up home visits and meets parents in school. Improved attendance will improve children's attainment as well as self-esteem and confidence.
