Communication, Language and Literacy

The stories we will be covering are: Jack and the Beanstalk and Jasper's Beanstalk. We will also be looking at non-fiction books about growing and planting seeds.

Mathematics - following NCETM

Continue to develop their subitising skills for numbers within and beyond 5, and increasingly connect quantities to numerals.

Begin to identify missing parts for numbers within 5

Explore the structure of the numbers 6 and 7 as '5 and a bit' and connect this to finger patterns and the Hungarian number frame.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

To care for plants and other living things. The children should be confident to speak in a familiar group and will talk about their ideas. They will choose the resources they need for their chosen activities. They will say when they do or don't need help.

To talk about our feelings and how actions have consequences.

Understanding the world

To know that other things grow from a seed than flowers.

Ordering pictures of growth

Experiment with growing cress/grass. (light & dark) To name parts of a plant.

Physical Development
